Residents, We Need Your Help!

Tree-protection is Failing in East Hills.


Unknown to many East Hills residents, the **Architectural Review Board** has been routinely allowing builders to **destroy ALL** (or **ALMOST** all) **trees** on properties when new homes are being built.

Recently, with full village approval, **FIVE** trees at **90 Revere Road** (Norgate) were cut down, and all **EIGHT** trees at **140 Walnut Drive** (Country Estates) were cut down.

Now, 37 Laurel Lane is facing a similar threat (see photo below). A developer proposes to **cut down FIVE** -- of SEVEN -- **huge** trees to allow expansion and cheaper installation of new septic systems. **Neighbors** *found out by chance* and are **totally OPPOSED.**

Only public opposition at the Village Board meeting this **Wednesday February 29th at 8 PM**, and at the vote at Architecture Board meeting **Monday March 5th at 8 PM** can tell the village this is **UNACCEPTABLE**. Then we must begin reforms -- see below.
